






Tribal member Roman Knudsen recently finished his assignment as a U.S. Army Drill Sergeant and was promoted to Sergeant First Class.





Domestic Violence Program holds Every Chi

The Ponca Tribe of Nebraska Domestic Violence program held a number of community awareness and education events for Every Child Matters Awareness Day in September. The DV program is working to raise awareness as more and more information is made public about the reality of residential schools. The Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada stated that 4000 to 6000 children who attended residential schools died (Aldred, 2023). This number increases as new findings take place at US residential schools such as Carlisle Indian Industrial School.

DV staff in Norfolk, Niobrara, Lincoln, and Omaha all hosted showings of the movie "Older Than America," which focuses on the lasting impact of residential schools on a family. In Norfolk, the DV Department partnered with the youth program for a pinwheel planting activity. Pinwheels were also planted as part of education and awareness activities in Lincoln, Omaha, and Niobrara. Awareness walks were also held in Lincoln, around the State Capital, and in downtown Sioux City, IA. These activities were all conducted to create awareness for the Every Child Matter movement.

Life satisfaction depends on our social support, emotion regulation, and resilience (Azpiazu et al., 2021). Family support has been found to be the most important factor. Forced assimilation impacted the indigenous family structure. In order to continue healing as a family, community, and tribal nations we need to stay resilient together and keep our sense of humor. The DV program events each month promote this resilience!

MEMBER NEEDED FOR GAMING COMMISSIONER VACANCY

The Tribal Council is accepting applications for a Gaming Commissioner as a term will be expiring on December 1, 2023. Commissioners are paid \$250 per meeting and \$100 for training work days, plus mileage reimbursement up to 410 miles roundtrip and applicable per diem is paid.

The Ponca Gaming Commission was established to regulate gaming on Ponca Indian Lands by enforcing the Ponca Gaming Ordinance.

This includes:

- Enforcing all NIGC and FBI requirements for Fingerprint background checks and approving all licenses for all KEY, PMO and Non-Gaming employees.
- Enforcing all NIGC and Gaming Commission Internal Controls for each department's policy and procedures.
- Approving all Department's Policies and Procedures to ensure compliance with the NIGC and state compact regulations.
- Granting the Facility license for any building that has gaming, ensuring that the Federal, State and Tribal building codes are enforced to protect the health and safety of the employees and the guests.

Qualifications:

- Must be at least 25 years of age and must not be a gaming-related employee, contractor of the Tribe or a member
 of the Tribal Council. Any appointment will be temporary, pending completion of a background investigation.
 No Commissioner may have committed a gambling or bribery offense, had a felony conviction, or have any
 financial interest in, or management responsibility for, any gaming activity governed by the Ordinance, including a
 Management Contract.
- · Must complete all Levels of the NIGC Commissioner Training and Master Class within the first year.
- Must complete the FBI's Level III Security Awareness Training and obtain a certificate prior to accessing any FBI Criminal History Reports to make licensing decisions.


